A Queally Center

The Queally Center is home to the Offices of Admission, Financial Aid, Career Services and Employer Development, Bursar, and Registrar. Spiders start and end their journey here with resources to help them along the way!

Upon exiting the front entrance, turn left on UR Drive and cross over Westhampton Way. On your left will be the main brick walkway leading up the hill between Cannon Memorial Chapel and Gottwald Center for the Sciences.

B University Forum

The University Forum is a central gathering place for students on campus. To your right is **Cannon** Memorial Chapel and the Wilton Center for Campus Ministries. Five global faith traditions are supported at UR through 14 campus ministries.

On your left is Gottwald Center for the Sciences. home to the departments of Chemistry, Biology, Biochemistry and Molecular Biology, and Physics. Gottwald features state-of-the-art lab equipment and 22 teaching laboratories. Richmond guarantees up to \$5,000 for an unpaid summer research or underpaid internship experience for all traditional undergraduates. Last year Richmond funded more than 490 summer fellowships totaling over \$2 million.

Passing Cannon Memorial Chapel on your right, continue right on the upper level walkway to enter Tyler Haynes Commons.

C Tyler Haynes Commons

Tyler Haynes Commons is the heart of campus. Here you will find the Career Services Advising Suite, the Bonner Center for Civic Engagement, the Center for Student Involvement, the Office of Scholars and Fellowships, Spider Shop, and more, all nestled in this building that spans the lake.

Once you exit the other end of the Commons, proceed straight up the hill on the main path and bear left after Boatwright Memorial Library. entering Stern Quadrangle.

D Stern Quadrangle

Stern Quadrangle is the main academic guad on campus. The Humanities Building, on your right, is the oldest academic building on campus and home to the departments of English, History, Classics, and Philosophy. Weinstein Hall, on your left, is home to the social sciences and is the first LEED-certified building on campus. At the farthest end of Stern Quadrangle, on your left, is the Jepson School of Leadership Studies, the first school of leadership studies in the nation.

Walk through Stern Quadrangle, passing the Humanities Building on your right. Up the hill and on your right is the Robins School of Business and on your left is the University of Richmond School of Law

Robins School of Business

Robins School of Business, a highly ranked business program with a foundation in liberal arts, stands on the small hill to your right. It is home to our Accounting, Business Administration, and Economics majors along with a variety of concentration areas such as Finance, Marketing, and International Business. The Business School also houses the Center for Innovation and Entrepreneurship that offers an interdisciplinary academic program, and other events and activities to enhance experiential learning, and is open to all students.

C School of Law

The University of Richmond School of Law founded in 1870, offers a J.D. and combined J.D./MBA programs and enjoys the same low student-to-faculty ratio as all other schools of the University.

Turn left on the pathway between the School of Law and Jepson Hall. Bear right on Founders Walk, entering the courtyard of the Carole Weinstein International Center.

G International Center

The Carole Weinstein International Center is home to several academic disciplines such as Global Studies and multiple languages, study abroad, the Office of International Education, faculty and classroom space, and Passport Café.

Pass through the courtyard and cross the street, heading straight for Robins Stadium.

Robins Stadium

Robins Stadium seats 8,700 and is a multisport venue serving the University's football, men's and women's lacrosse, and women's track & field programs. The University boasts 17 Division I varsity sports teams, 32 club sports teams, and numerous intramural teams.

To the left of Robins Stadium is the Well-Being Center and Weinstein Center for Recreation.



Well-Being Center and Weinstein

The **Well-Being Center** is the newest building on campus that conveniently houses all areas of student wellness under one roof. The Well-Being Center is home to the Student Health Center, Counseling and Psychological Services as well as

Attached to the Well-Being Center is the Weinstein Center for Recreation which features two floors of fitness machines and free weights, several multipurpose rooms for free exercise classes, squash and racquetball courts, a swimming pool, a three-court gymnasium, and

Follow the brick path from the Well-Being Center towards Richmond Way. Turn right near Robins Hall and continue down the path until Whitehurst

U Student Center for Equity

The Student Center for Equity and Inclusion, or SCEI for short, fosters inclusive communities and

empowers students through dedicated student organizations, affinity groups, campus-wide ally trainings, celebratory events, access to a Multicultural Student Space, LGBTQ+ Student Lounge, and much more! This office primarily serves as a resource for our Multicultural, First Generation, Limited Income, and LGBTQIA+ students; but all UR members are encouraged to participate in SCEI programs that center cross-cultural dialogue and learning.

Follow the path from Whitehurst until you reach a circular brick opening where you will see multiple residence halls and benches.

Wood Circle

Wood Circle is a central location to many of our residence halls such as Wood Hall, Residence Hall No. 2 and Residence Hall No. 3. Around 90 percent of undergraduates live on campus all four years.

Laundry facilities are free to students. Access to residence halls is limited to Richmond students and only to residents of that building after 2 a.m.

Follow the brick path towards Richmond Way on your left heading towards Westhampton Lake. On your left will be Boatwright Memorial Library.

Boatwright Memorial Library

Students take advantage of a number of resource centers in **Boatwright Memorial Library**, including the Media Resource, Technology Learning, and Academic Skills Center. They also frequent the popular 8:15 café for coffee and baked goods and relax on the spacious lawn. The main facility of Boatwright is open 24/5, and the main entrance faces the lake.

Continue to follow the path alongside the lake. When you approach Tyler Haynes Commons, vou can continue on the outdoor path by the lake and climb the stairs on your left to enter the University Forum. Or, you can enter the building at ground level to find an elevator at the entrance that can be taken to the second level and leads to the University Forum. From the University Forum you will continue straight on Wilton Way, stopping at the Heilman Center on your right.

M Heilman Center

The Heilman Center is the central dining hall offering all-you-care-to-eat dining. The Heilman Dining Center is open from 7 a.m. to 8 p.m. during the academic year. It is also home to the campus post office and a convenience store.

Continue up the hill on Wilton Way. Once you cross Westhampton Way, turn left in front of Booker Hall of Music and continue straight to the front entrance of the Modlin Center for the Arts.

N Modlin Center for the Arts and **Booker Hall of Music**

The Modlin Center for the Arts and Booker Hall of Music draw international performing groups and ensembles to campus, most of which are either free or discounted to students. Across the green are North Court and South Court, which house classrooms, academic departments, and residence hall rooms.

From the Modlin Center for the Arts walk through the archway and down the hill on Keller Road. Turn right on Westhampton Way. Lora Robins Court will be on your right.

O Lora Robins Court

Lora Robins Court is one of the residence halls that house first-year students. Lora Robins Court currently houses many of our Richmond Endeavor students which is one of our livinglearning communities. Students live in the same residence hall and participate together in a class, group travel, and co-curricular activities with a faculty mentor.

> As you exit Lora Robins Court, turn right on Westhampton Way and the Queally Center will be on your right. You have completed the tour!
